___ If your home was built before 1978, you and your family could be at risk of exposure to lead. 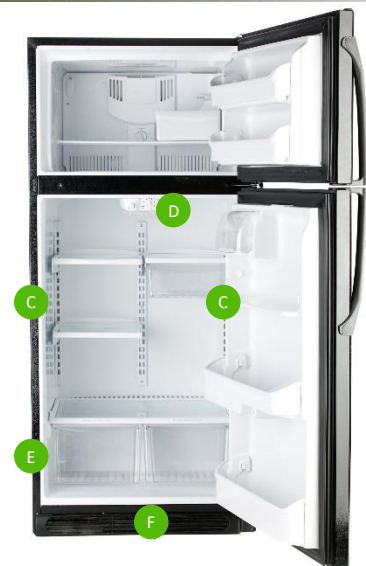


Find Manufactured Date

Unable to Read or Find Refrigerator Label

- If your refrigerator label isn't identifiable, we will need to set up a 2-3 hour metering appointment to determine how much energy is being used by the refrigerator. Only if the energy usage meets our requirements will the refrigerator be replaced.

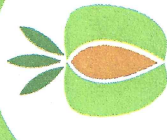

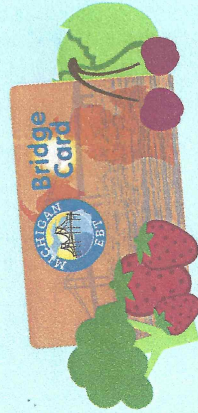

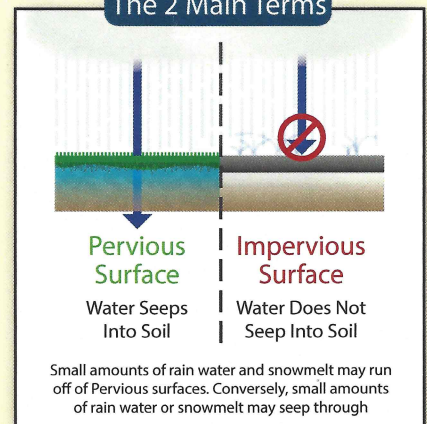

What is Drainage?

Drainage: Rainwater or snowmelt that drains from your property into the combined sewer system.

The 2 Main Terms



1. Rain and snow fall on your property.

2. Rainwater and snowmelt seep through **pervious** surfaces like lawns

3. This seepage flows into the soil and becomes groundwater.

4. Rainwater and snowmelt on hard, **impervious** surfaces such as driveways do not seep into the soil and become runoff.

5. This runoff is mixed with dirt and debris and becomes polluted.

6. Runoff is combined with wastewater in the **combined sewer system**.

8. Runoff and wastewater are treated, as required by state and federal law.

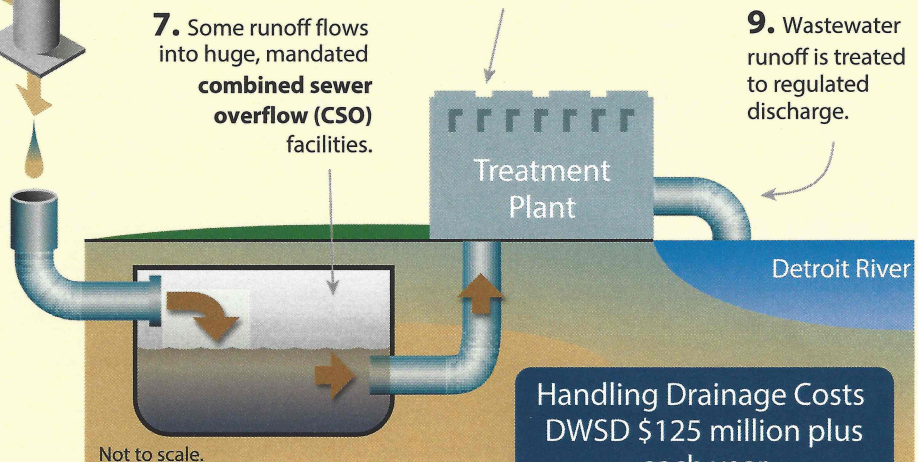
9. Wastewater runoff is treated to regulated discharge.

7. Some runoff flows into huge, mandated **combined sewer overflow (CSO)** facilities.

Different parts of your Detroit home or business property handle rainwater and snowmelt in different ways. Lawns and gardens allow water to soak through, while concrete and similar surfaces limit water from soaking into the ground, creating runoff into sewers.



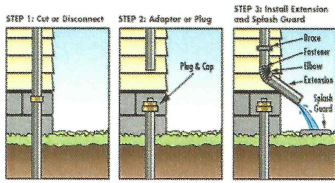

GREEN infrastructure at home

Green infrastructure (GI) is a multifaceted approach to managing stormwater runoff to help protect homes, health, and the environment. Many cities are developing large scale GI projects, but we can also take part by managing our own runoff right where we live.



One simple thing to do is **DOWNSPOUT DISCONNECTION**. If your downspout still feeds right into the sewer, you can redirect that water into a lawn, garden, or rainbarrel.



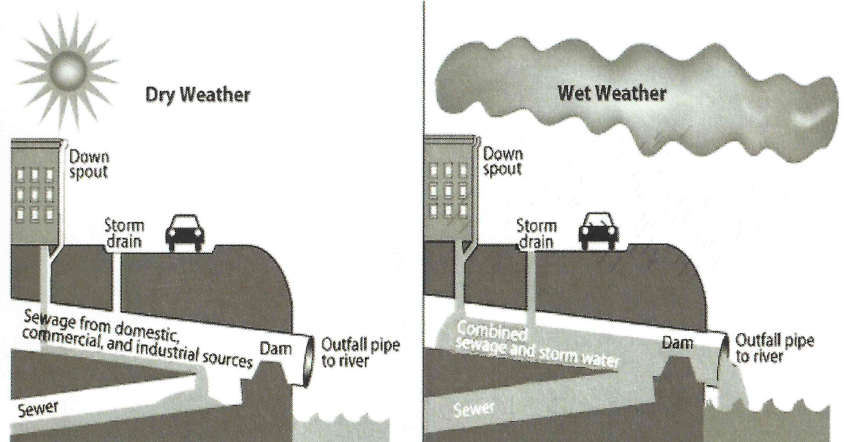
A **RAIN BARREL** can also help slow the flow of stormwater from your roof by collecting it from your downspout and storing it for future use in the garden or washing cars.



TREE PLANTING is a good way to soak up extra water as well, while providing benefits such as shade and beauty while purifying the air.



RAIN GARDENS are an increasingly popular way to manage water with special design and deep-rooting plants to help water get absorbed into the soil.

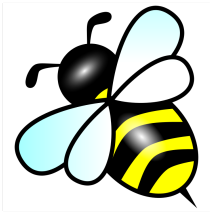

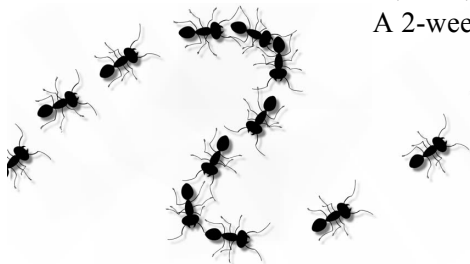

WHAT HELP IS PROVIDED?

FREE lead Inspection (\$750 value) on your home.

FREE lead safety work which may include new windows, doors, painting, special cleaning or plumbing repairs.

WHAT IS THE COST?

Owner Occupied – We may provide an average of \$10,000 or more. You may be asked to pay a small fee.

Landlords– We may provide an average of \$10,000 or more. You will be asked to contribute a small portion of cost.

Tenants- There is no cost to you. We need your landlord's permission before starting work.



You may qualify for help if you meet all criteria in EITHER Option 1 OR Option 2 below:

OPTION 1

- ◇ There must be a child under 19 years of age or pregnant female enrolled in Medicaid
- ◇ Your home must be located in Flint, Detroit OR elsewhere if a child under 19 years of age with a lead level of 5 or higher resides.

OPTION 2

- ◇ There must be a child under 6 years of age **OR** a pregnant female LIVING IN the home
- ◇ Your home must be located in Genesee, Ingham, Jackson, Kalamazoo, Kent, Lenawee, Macomb, Oakland or Saginaw county or the city of Detroit, **OR** elsewhere if a child under 6 years of age with a lead level of 5 or higher resides
- ◇ Occupant income (**gross**) must be low or moderate
- ◇ Your home or apartment must be built prior to 1978
- ◇ The property taxes on your home must be paid up-to-date or on an active payment plan.
